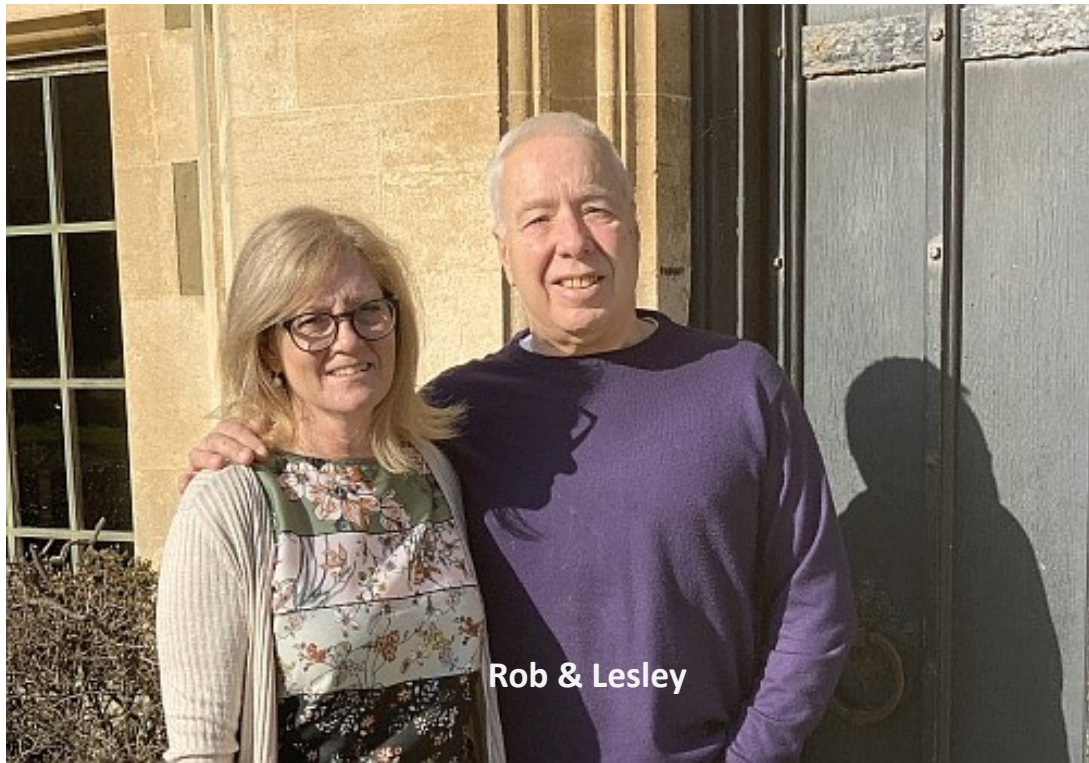
This delay, will however help us to have all the funding ready and give us more time for preparation, and ensure we have all the permits in place for the work to begin.
